CLINTON - "Royalty" will be a popular theme throughout Clinton schools beginning Monday.

The Clinton Community School District's fourth Royalty Week will get underway Monday, serving as a chance to celebrate the successes of the district with students, staff and administration. The week is packed full of activities at each of the district's schools, recognizing the work of all students.

CCSD Superintendent Deb Olson looks forward to Royalty Week every year, jumping at the chance to celebrate the great things about the district.

"Choose Excellence" will highlight Tuesday's activities, which includes the Eagle Heights Elementary recognition assembly at 8:45 a.m., along with Bluff Elementary Family Night scheduled for 5 p.m.

Wednesday's activities, with the theme of "Do for Others," includes a showcase of Clinton High School's RTI program at 8 a.m., and a CHS Tri II Band concert at 7 p.m.

Thursday carries the theme of "Rise Above," beginning with a Whittier Elementary recognition ceremony of third grade through fifth grade at 9:45 a.m. Whittier's kindergarten through second grade recognition assembly is scheduled for 2:30 p.m. Bluff Elementary's recognition ceremony will be held at 2:15 p.m.

The day also will feature a Clinton Middle School Tri II concert at 7 p.m., as well as a CHS band concert at 7 p.m.

Capping off the school week with "Pride" on Friday, a CHS pep assembly is set for 12:55 p.m., and a CMS assembly will be held at 2 p.m.

The public is invited to attend all celebratory events with the district's students, families, teachers and administrators.
