Royalty Week Schedule

CLINTON — Next week is about celebration for supporters of Clinton Schools.

Starting Monday and ending on Friday, each of the Clinton School District's facilities will co-host "Royalty Week," a culmination of events that highlight all of the factions that make a district function. Community members, employees and students are all part of the celebration. Superintendent Deb Olson said it's a time to focus on the work the schools have accomplished.

"It's to draw attention to all of the great things that go on in our district and to celebrate all of the great people that make it happen," Olson said. "It seems like we can't do enough to tell everybody about all of the great work that goes on."

Each day has a special theme. Monday and Tuesday celebrate community supporters and employees with a kick-off Clinton High assembly at 8:15 a.m.; Wednesday through Friday highlight middle, elementary and high schoolers.

Formerly known as "Pride Week," Royalty Week is a play on the district's mascot — The River Kings and Queens. Thus next week's sporting events are incorporated into the celebration. Tuesday's and Friday's basketball doubleheaders are part of the festivities, as well as Thursday night's CHS band concert. Spectators on Friday are encouraged to sport school colors.

Olson has a kick-off of her own. On Monday she will present to the Rotary Club what there is to be proud of at Clinton schools.

"I think the big thing is that the traditional viewpoint of school is changing, and it has to change to reflect our world today," Olson said. "It's about what we're going to do with the information when we have it."

Monday's speech will focus on the district's approach to collaboration and how technology is integrated into 21st Century learning styles.

With a slate of activities on a daily basis, Olson hopes the community will take part in Royalty Week.

"Coming to our assemblies would be a great thing for the public," she said. "For us, it's about supporting your children, our youth, our schools."
